



**Garnet & Opal Brooch by Dorrie Nossiter | Arts & Crafts c.1920s  
POA**

A vivid bouquet of almandine garnets and glowing opals bursts from this lyrical brooch by Dorrie Nossiter, made in England in the 1920s and crafted in gilt silver.

At approximately 8cm by 4.5cm, the piece captures the romantic essence of the Arts & Crafts movement with its scrolling tendrils, organic composition, and richly coloured stones.

Nossiter's work is more closely aligned with Arts & Crafts ideals than with the sharper lines of Art Deco, despite being made during the same era.

Her style is intuitive and expressive - less about symmetry, more about movement and feeling.

This brooch embodies her distinctive approach: hand-wrought, joyful, and entirely individual.

A flamboyant figure, Dorrie Nossiter was also part of a turning point in design history.

The Arts & Crafts movement gave women like her an unprecedented platform - one in which their work could stand equally beside that of their male counterparts.

This brooch is more than decorative: it's a piece of that legacy.

Excellent antique condition. All stones appear original and securely set. Pin fitting functions smoothly and holds firmly.

Pieces by Dorrie Nossiter rarely come to market - especially on this scale and with such a vivid, expressive gemstone palette. This brooch is a quintessential example of her lyrical, hand-wrought style, bridging the romanticism of the Arts & Crafts movement with a deeply personal design language. It would make a prized addition to any collection of British studio jewellery, Arts & Crafts design, or 20th-century women makers.
