



Gold Signet Ring with Sardonyx Intaglio | c.1930s, 14ct POA

A refined example of early 20th-century craftsmanship, this signet ring is set in solid 14ct gold and features a crisply carved sardonyx intaglio.

The design showcases a traditional coat of arms, complete with heraldic shield, mantling, and a cresting bird - symbols of family, identity, and continuity.

Made in Germany in the 1930s, the ring reflects the enduring value placed on heritage and personal symbolism during this period.

The deep blue and white layers of the sardonyx are finely executed, offering both clarity and contrast.

Measuring 1cm by 0.8cm across the face, the ring has a substantial yet elegant presence, with a smooth, tapered band and a confident silhouette.

Fully hallmarked "585" gold standard, this piece is a timeless example of signet design, discreetly bold and beautifully balanced.

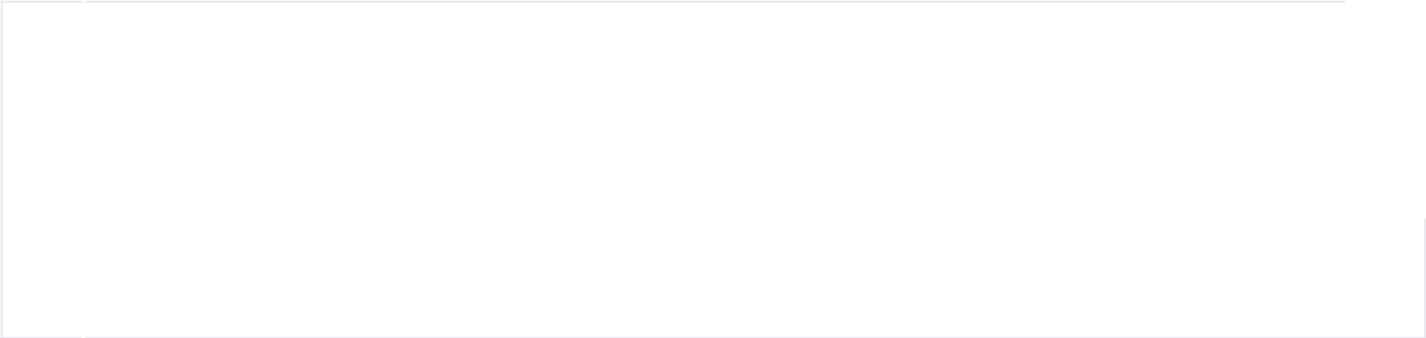
