Ming Dynasty 13th - 15th Century.
Depicting a Kylin (Dragon) on cash.

The Kylin refers to the Qilin, a mythical Chinese creature with the appearance of a horse and a dragon, it is also known as the Chinese unicorn and is a symbol of good luck, prosperity and benevolence. The Qilin is said to appear in conjunction with the arrival of a Sage or virtuous ruler. The Cash or Qian was a type of coin of China and the Sinosphere, used from the 4th Century B.C.E. In summary the Kylin's presence on cash reflects its significance as a symbol of good fortune and wealth within Chinese cultures.

The natural Jade stone is non dyed and set with rustic inclusions.
