



**Near pair of Chinese blue and white beaker vases, Kangxi (1662-1722)

Near pair of Chinese blue and white beaker vases, Kangxi (1662-1722), decorated to the centre with quatrefoil cartouches containing two fan shaped panels enclosing a lady in a fenced garden near two towers within beribboned objects variously comprising the 'hundred antiquities', with a spray of flowering lotus to the lower body and peony to the upper body, within a flowerhead and ruyi patterned border to the rim and foot, height of taller: 12 in. (30.5 cm.), height of shorter: 11 7/8 in. (30.35 cm.); condition: rims slightly ground, one with two hairlines to body. This pattern is also found on other blue and white vessels of differing shape.
