





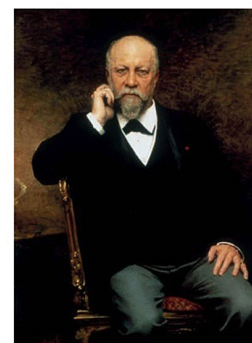

Biography

Frédéric Boucheron was the first jeweller to move to Place Vendôme, which he did in 1855. Legend has it that he chose 26 Place Vendôme, where Boucheron remains to this day, because it was the turned corner of the square. He believed that the diamonds in the windows would signify all the more brilliantly.

Czar Alexander III was a client, as was his son, the doomed Nicholas II. Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother was especially fond of her Boucheron line which she inherited from Lady Camille, who originally purchased it from the House. Her grandson Prince Charles passed the line onto his wife Camilla, Duchess of Cornwall as a wedding gift. Queen Elizabeth of England also has a collection of Boucheron jewels as did Wallis Simpson the Duchess of Windsor.
