



Belle Époque Enamel Ivy Ring | Rose-Cut Diamonds | 18ct Gold | French c.1890 POA

A rare and poetic jewel from the Belle Époque, this French ring c.1890 captures the delicate romance of the era in hand-painted enamel and gold.

The ivy motif - a symbol of enduring affection and fidelity - wraps around the finger in finely painted green enamel, its leaves naturalistic yet stylised in true late 19th-century fashion.

Set with shimmering rose-cut diamonds, each leaf glints softly in the light, drawing the eye along the graceful 18ct gold band.

The craftsmanship is precise but tender: from the subtle veining of the hand-painted enamel to the gentle asymmetry of the foliage, every detail feels quietly alive.

It's a ring that is feminine, rare, and effortlessly elegant.

As romantic and wearable today as it was over a century ago.

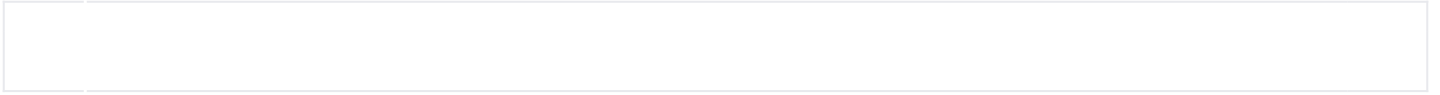
