





Victorian 23ct Gold Quiver of Arrows Brooch | William Tell Archery Club | Dated 25 August 1880 POA

A beautifully made Victorian brooch in exceptionally high-grade 23 carat gold, engraved on the reverse:

"Presented by the William Tell Archery Club, August 25 1880."

Shaped as a quiver of arrows - a nod to skill, precision, and classical virtue - it was likely awarded as a prize or token of recognition, perhaps at a club competition or ceremony.

The reference to William Tell adds symbolic weight: honour, courage, and pride in ability. This isn't just decorative, it tells the story of a proud moment in the summer of 1880.

At 6cm long, it's striking but refined, with a satisfying weight and quiet confidence.
