



Georgian Pearl & Emerald Ring | 9ct Gold | c.1790s–1820s POA

This exquisite Georgian ring features a vivid foil-backed emerald framed by a double halo of luminous natural seed pearls, arranged in a classic floral cluster design.

Likely crafted between 1790 and 1820, it reflects the refined sentimentality and symbolic elegance of late 18th-century jewellery.

Rings like this were worn by women of status - often to candlelit dinners, portraits, or formal occasions - where the glowing emerald and soft pearls would catch the light and draw admiration.

Emeralds were prized for their associations with renewal and protection, while pearls symbolised purity, memory, and quiet strength.

The setting is entirely Georgian in design and detail, while the 9ct gold shank is a later replacement, likely added in the 19th or early 20th century to preserve its wearability.

This is a common and careful update for antique rings and ensures the piece can continue to be worn and enjoyed without compromising its history.

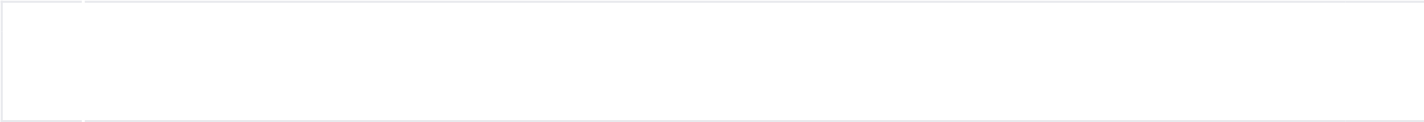
