



Silver Marcasite & Coral Ring | 935 Silver | Art Deco c.1920s POA

This striking 1920s ring captures the bold glamour of the Art Deco era with a vibrant coral centrepiece, surrounded by a scalloped halo of round coral cabochons and framed in delicately set marcasite. Crafted in 935 silver - a higher-purity silver often used in continental Europe - the ring shows the fine workmanship and balance of form that defined interwar design.

The decorative face of the ring measures 2cm by 1.5cm, and the ring itself is a UK size N.

The setting is marked 935, indicating a likely origin in Germany or Austria, where coral and marcasite were highly favoured combinations in the 1920s.

This isn't just a beautiful piece - it's a snapshot of its time.

Coral brought warmth and energy, while marcasite offered an affordable but sparkling alternative to diamonds.

Together, they created jewellery that was rich in personality but still elegant enough to be worn day-to-evening.

The design blends Art Deco geometry with a soft floral influence - a style worn by modern, fashion-conscious women in cities like Vienna, Berlin, or Paris, paired with silk dresses, cloche hats, and sharply tailored coats.

The hand-set marcasite stones add subtle shimmer and frame the coral beautifully, like a piece of miniature architecture.

In excellent vintage condition, this ring is both collectable and wearable, a bold but balanced piece of Deco-era design with real historical charm.
