A George V Silver Incense-Boat, by Nathan and Hayes, Chester, 1911.

Gothic style, inspired by the medieval Ramsey Abbey incense boat, oval and on shaped foot, the ends with ram's mask finials, the cover pierced and with a faceted ball finial. The incense-boat which is the inspiration for the present example was discovered in 1850 at the bottom of Whittlesea Mere, Huntingdonshire, dated to circa 1350 and is now in the collection of the Victoria and Albert Museum
