



**Sterling Silver - HIP FLASK - Edward H Stockwell Thornhill & Co 1873

A excellent example of an antique sterling silver 2 piece hip flask and cup.

This flask is a heavy weighted prime example of Victorian workmanship, made by Edward H Stockwell, and retailed by Thornhill & Co, of New Bond St. Stockwell is a highly collected maker, and Thornhill & Co a highly respected retailer of the period.

This is a fine, premium quality example features a bayonet cap, mounted on a large oval kidney shaped body. The cup fits flush to the flask. A flask is of a generous size that has no engravings, and the heavy gauge suggests that this could be suitable for personalisation if desired.

Comes without the original box, but supplied with one of our grey velvet pouches.

Markings: Fully hallmarked for .925 sterling silver, dated London 1873. Sponsors mark "EHS", plus retailers engravings as per images above. Weight of 232 grams.

Size: Measures 5 1/2" (14 cm) tall, 3 1/2" (9 cm) wide. Approx. 5.5 fl oz, 155 ml.

Condition: Item is in excellent condition, professionally cleaned, polished and re-corked, ready to go. Some very very slight signs of use commensurate with age - please see images above.
